What if you could have access to fresh produce right in our neighborhood? The Clayton board is currently exploring interest in a community garden. With approval, space would be dedicated in the common area near the pool.

Over the last several years, consciousness about knowing where our food comes from, eating healthy and eating locally has increased. As a result, interest in establishing permanent community gardens has also grown. Our goal is to gauge the long-term sustainability of a community garden based on current community interest.

Residents could grow flowers, vegetables or herbs and there could be one community plot or many individual plots. The garden could provide informational demonstrations or just a place for the community to gather – either way it will definitely build a sense of community and belonging to those who participate.

Of course, there will be costs associated with getting the garden up and running, but fortunately, we can apply for grants.
