Scholarship Strategy

Scholarship is a type of financial aid, which a student does not have to pay back. These funds cover expenses associated with college cost, such as, tuition, books, etc. Today, getting a scholarship means competing in a very competitive market. It is recommended that students have a strategic plan to increase their chances of securing scholarship funding. Here are a few tips to help students when applying for scholarships.

Document

- Create a list of your personal assets (skills, clubs, groups, community service hours, religious affiliation, work experience, awards won, and hobbies).
- Get organized by setting timelines for researching scholarships, getting references and start writing.

Search

- 1. Start searching for scholarships.
 - a. Internet
 - Printed materials at the library or check with your school counselor.
 - c. Networking with other students or teachers.
- 2. Sign up for scholarship search sites.
- Create a tracking spreadsheet to keep up with deadlines and to check off completed applications.

Match

- I. Review the scholarship criteria.
- 2. Evaluate the deadline.
- 3. Check the application requirements.

Apply

- I. Fill out the applications.
- Write essays.
- 3. Obtain Letters of recommendation.

Remember that applying for scholarship funding can be a complex process, but it is a great way to finance your education.
