This event is for families of Clayton residents only and proof of residency will be required. Please bring DL, ID or a utility bill that shows your name and address in Clayton. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an resident adult over the age of 21.

The Annual Meeting for the Clayton HOA is **Wednesday, November 21, 2012 at 7:00 p.m.** We will have a table set up so that Home Owners can complete and sign a proxy assigning your proxy to someone else just in case you are not be able to attend the meeting.

You can assign your proxy to anyone who will be attending the meeting, including individual Clayton Board Members or the Board as a whole. The person you assign your proxy to will vote on your behalf if you are unable to attend the annual meeting. If you are able to attend the meeting the proxy is voided and you can vote in person.

In order to hold the meeting, we **must** have 10% of the Clayton Home Owners present at the meeting either in person or by proxy. If we do not have 10% a new meeting must be called. Not only is it a major inconvenience but it means additional costs for mailing a second notice to 507 homes as well as the cost of renting the club house, etc.



The City of Houston and a collaborative group of local governments across our region have updated the "Houston Hide From The Wind" website,

www.HoustonHideFromTheWind.org

This newly redesigned tool helps residents across an expanded 13 county region find out what the forecasted wind speed is for their area in the event of a storm. The map also shows residents whether or not an evacuation has been ordered for their zip code. When no storm is forecasted to impact the Houston area, the site shows information from a simulated storm for demonstration purposes.

The site's intent is to encourage residents who live outside of areas with a storm surge threat to make plans to shelter-in-place during hurricanes and tropical storms, freeing up evacuation routes for coastal residents with a higher level of threat from storm surge. Historical storm information is also available from Hurricane Ike and

Home Work Suggestions

Success comes to those who are prepared; therefore, you must always be prepared. Here are a few study skills tips and reading strategies to help you to succeed in school.

Tips to Building Your Study Skills

Find a quiet place to help you focus. (Avoid distractions, such as television, cell phones, ipods, etc.)

Always study in the same place. Sit in a straight -backed chair in a well lit room. The light will keep you alert.

Build a study kit so that you have the necessary tools near you. The study kit should include a ruler, pens, pencils, paper, erasers, paper clips, note cards, a dictionary, highlighter, and a calculator. Keep your workspace neat and clean.

Strategies for Reading

Read the review questions before the textbook assignments, look for the answers while you are reading. This will help you to focus. Understand what you are reading from groups of words rather than individual words.

Read different kinds of reading materials to discover your preferred reading materials. The more you read, the easier and more enjoyable reading will become.

Write a summary of the material in your own words. Review your notes to help you to remember what you have read.

Look up words that you do not understand. This will help you to learn the meaning of the word and build your vocabulary.

Early Voting

Any qualified voter may vote in person at the main early voting polling place or at **any other designated early voting branch location** during designated times. Currently there are 37 early voting locations in Harris County.

Early Voting Hours of Operation

October 22 - October 26: 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
October 27: 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.
October 28: 1:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.
October 29 - November 2: 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.

On Election Day, in Texas, a voter must vote at the voting location the precinct in which he or she is registered to vote has been designated to vote.
